What do they need?

- **Developmentally**

They are asking: Do I have what it takes? They are motivated by fun.
Respond by: Engaging their interests

- **Spiritually**

Provoke discovery so they will trust God’s character and experience God’s family.

Basic Truths to teach and reinforce:

- I should treat others the way I want to be treated.
 - I can trust God no matter what.
 - I need to make the wise choice.
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How to lead at home

 - I became so worried and sad that I wanted to find a new way to live.
 - When I learned about Jesus, I gave my life to him, and he brought me peace and joy!
